The following notice gives notice of the variation of an environmental permit.

This permit variation came as a result of an operator led variation to increase annual tonnage/through put to no more than 200,000 metric tonnes per annum. The site handles non-waste and waste materials. An updated Dust Management Plan was included as part of this application.

2.4 Improvement programme

- 2.4.1 The operator shall complete the improvements specified in schedule 1 table S1.3 by the date specified in that table unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Environment Agency.
- 2.4.2 Except in the case of an improvement which consists only of a submission to the Environment Agency, the operator shall notify the Environment Agency within 14 days of completion of each improvement.

IC1	The operator shall submit an updated Dust Management Plan in writing to the Environment Agency for the Environment Agency's written approval. The updated the Dust Management Plan must include: • Evidence of the optical monitoring system that has been installed on the site. • Proposed frequency for calibration of optical monitoring systems. • Proposed trigger levels and plans for corrective actions if the trigger levels are exceeded. And, • Proposals for notifying the Environment Agency within 24 hours of the detection of a trigger level being breached. Provide evidence that any required changes have been put into place to meet the requirements of the updated Dust Management Plan, including: • All required infrastructure And, • All dust suppression systems are in place and operational. Prior to increasing the daily throughput, annual throughput, and storage tonnages, you must gain approval in writing from the Environment Agency for the amended Dust Management Plan.	Within 3 months of permit issue or as otherwise agreed in writing by the Environment Agency.
